Lawrence Carl Landfried, 70, went home to be with his Lord on Saturday, October 27, 2018, at his home in Rockwall. Larry, born April 27, 1948, grew up in Cincinnati, Ohio. He graduated with a degree from Miami University of Ohio in 1970, and then served our country in the United States Air Force. While working at Raytheon in Santa Barbara, he met the love of his life, Judy Woodard, while giving blood at a blood drive. They later married in Bozeman, Montana.

Larry and Judy grew their family while living in Bozeman, Bakersfield, CA, and, finally, in Rockwall, TX, where they have lived for 33 years. Together, they loved their family and invested incredible amounts of time caring for their children and grandchildren.
