Vicki Jo (Dunford) Hall, was born August 14, 1945, in Waxahachie, TX, to Douglas and Dorothy (Hall) Dunford. Vicki grew up in the Waxahachie area and attended Waxahachie High School and graduated Class of 1964. Vicki married Joe Greenhill and had a son, Kirk. Later, she met Mike Hall in the fall of 1970. They married on May 12, 1972 and they had two children together, Jason and Justin Hall. With all those boys, she had to be a stern and tough mom, but also compassionate and loving when needed. She loved to sing and listen to music from the 50s through today's hits. She taught her boys how to sing and have an ear for music as well. She also enjoyed to read and write poetry. She kept several of her poetry in binders and booklets here and there. Vicki was creative or "artsy fartsy" if you will. She loved to make wreaths, do all kinds of crafts. She also had a green thumb and could grow plants like no other. She loved animals, especially dogs. She was a wonderful cook and loved to feed her family and friends. This was our Vicki.

When her sons became men and began having children of their own, this only filled her heart with more love. She was no longer "Vicki", but "Granny Vicki"

Mike said they were like two old hippies, grooving to classic rock-n-roll, or classic country, way before it was called "classic." With her love of music, she always had a radio on in every room, each on a different station. He has been there through all of her struggles with illness these past years, and will miss her terribly.

Vicki was a woman of faith. It was this faith that carried her through her battles with chronic pain and illness. In her last days on this Earth, she recalled being at the Farley Street Baptist Church where she attended as a child. It will be this same faith that carries her family through their grief.

On Sunday, January 6, 2019, Vicki Hall was called Home. She was greeted above by her parents: Doug and Dorothy Dunford; her baby brother: Douglas Dunford, Jr. and her grandson: Skylar Hall; also a childhood dog: Penny and her sweet dog: Daisy.
